Dawson Hosts Kick-off Event

(CONROE, TX) — Commissioner of Precinct 2 Candidate Brian Dawson held his Campaign Kick-off last week, entertaining and informing a large crowd about his concerns and plans for Montgomery County Commissioners Court. Dawson stood to explain to the standing room only crowd that he was concerned about the existing court's efforts to publicize holding the line on tax increases when they were actually hiding behind rapidly increasing property values resulting in the continued increase in property taxes.

Dawson also commented that there should be more effort from local government to make contacts with and influence state government when there is legislation that will benefit Montgomery County taxpayers, such as Senate Bill 2 during this last session.

Zero-based budgeting was another topic that Dawson says he embraces, because he says it allows for prioritization. He explained that law enforcement and infrastructure were the highest priorities for county government and zero-based budging would help focus on those issues. He went on to add that mobility was a big issue, specifically for Precinct 2, and that he fully supported a Mobility Plan for the entire county. He also addressed leveraging tax dollars and petitioning state and federal governments to have some of those tax dollars returned to our community.
